


























Christmas Pudding Swim

Swim England

As we are affiliated to Swim England, we are expected to conduct our activities within the rules of the Association and adopt and implement their Child Safeguarding Policy and Procedures. These are laid out in the Wavepower 2020/2023 manual.

These rules also include the Swim England Code of Conduct and Code of Ethics. These documents will soon be added to the website under the Safeguarding tab and we ask you to read each category carefully so you know what is expected of you as a member of our club.

New Swim England membership category names.

Here are the new changes to the category names for Swim England and a brief description of what they mean. Our affiliation involves registering each member with Swim England. JLDSC membership subscriptions cover the cost of this as a club train or club support member. Active life members who no longer pay an annual subscription are requested to pay this fee. If someone is registered as a club compete member we request they pay the difference.

Existing Name	New Name	Category Descriptor	Fee
Category One	Club Train	For individuals who are training in any discipline.	£15.35
Category Two	Club Compete	For individuals who are looking to compete in any discipline.	£35.15
Category Three	Club Support	For any non-swimming individual who is involved.	£5.25
